You'll be in the know

- As a member, you have access to a network of resources, data, EAC and community partnership webinars, and expert analysis on local, national and international issues.
- All EAC members receive our bi-weekly electronic newsletter and a subscription to our triannual magazine Ecology and Action.

You can channel your activism through EAC

- Volunteerism and citizen engagement are central to how we do our work. There are lots of ways to get involved! You can join an Action Committee, help organize a campaign, do research, write for our magazine, answer the phones, paint signs, or help with administrative tasks.

Tax Receipts

- The EAC is a registered non-profit society with charitable status. At the end of each year we send out a receipt for the total amount donated annually so you can claim them on your income tax return.





Membership Options

Sustaining Monthly Membership

- Sustaining memberships are an automatic monthly gift that you can pay in an easy, ongoing way.
- The amount you choose will be billed each month from your account (credit card, visa debit, or direct bank withdrawal), starting on whichever date you choose.
- Many of our members start by giving \$30 a month, which equals \$1 a day. But, you can be an EAC Sustaining Member starting at \$5 a month. It is entirely up to you!

Annual Membership

- Prefer to make a larger one-time donation? Then an annual membership might be for you!
- Feel free to reach out to learn about our senior and student rates!

Gift Membership

- Show your friends and family you care by gifting them a membership to EAC!
- This is a perfect contactless, eco-friendly, and meaningful gift for birthdays, holidays, anniversaries and other special occasions.

Why support monthly?

1. Monthly giving provides the Ecology Action Center with steady, reliable, and predictable funding. This helps us look into the future and budget for the needs of our long-term programs.
2. It's the most flexible way to give! You choose an amount that works for you, and can alter your donations or suspend them for up to four months in a row at any time, giving you a break from giving altogether.
3. Many people find it better to give smaller amounts over a longer period of time rather than one larger sum all at once.
4. It's greener! It helps cut down on administrative costs and involves less paper processing. Each time someone donates we provide a receipt, input the donor information, and contact annually. When you donate monthly, there is far less of this to do.
5. It's the easiest way to give; No remembering required! Your monthly donation is automatically withdrawn from your account.

The EAC is Nova Scotia's oldest and largest environmental charity. Since 1971 we've been taking leadership on critical issues ranging from climate change, to biodiversity protection, to environmental justice.

Our work is generally organized by seven action areas:



Built Environment:

Our Built Environment Team believes in building inclusive and dynamic communities that function in harmony with the natural and social environment. By engaging with issues related to urban planning, building design and construction, we strive for healthy, affordable, and dynamic places to live, work and play.

Coastal

Our Coastal Team works for a future where all coastal systems in Nova Scotia are healthy, valued and protected, and everyone is connected to these unique and crucial ecosystems. They seek to engage the public to offer the knowledge, confidence and support necessary to take action for our coast!



Energy

Climate change inevitably impacts all of us. Our Energy Team inspires Nova Scotians to prosper in a future that is free of fossil fuels, where energy is used as efficiently as possible. Through education, consultation and advocacy with the public and government, we work for a just transition into a better energy future that leaves no one behind.





Food

Our Food Team works to build a community around food in Nova Scotia and New Brunswick. We're creating spaces where people can connect about food; to learn and share ideas, success stories, solutions and ways to get involved. We work at the individual, community and systemic level to increase access to local, nutritious food.

Marine

Our Marine Team works locally, nationally and internationally to protect marine ecosystems and advocate for sustainable fisheries, which support vibrant coastal communities and livelihoods.



Transportation

Our Transportation Team believes in a future where making sustainable transportation decisions is easy. Walking and biking will be safe and convenient, and a culture of active living will exist. Public transit will be accessible, affordable, convenient, interconnected and reliable. We're working everyday towards that future.

Wilderness

Our Wilderness Team works to save the terrestrial biodiversity of Nova Scotia. Their advocacy focuses on three areas:

1. Protecting Core Areas as Anchors of Biodiversity;
2. Advocating for Healthy, Connected Working Landscapes;
3. Building a Culture of Nature Appreciation and Engagement.
